



Saint Valentine of Rome

Saint Valentine, officially known as Saint Valentine of Rome, is a third-century Roman Saint widely celebrated on February 14 and commonly associated with "courtly love." Although not much of St. Valentine's life is reliably known, it is highly agreed that St. Valentine was martyred and then buried on the Via Flaminia just north of Rome. The legends attributed to this mysterious saint are as inconsistent as the actual identification of the man.

One common story about St. Valentine is that in one point of his life as the former Bishop of Terni, Narnia and Amelia, he was on house arrest by Judge Asterius. While discussing religion and faith with the Judge, Valentine pledged the validity of Jesus. The judge immediately put Valentine and his faith to the test. St. Valentine was presented with the judge's blind daughter and told to restore her sight. If he succeeded, the judge vowed to do anything for Valentine. Placing his hands onto her eyes, Valentine restored the child's vision. Judge Asterius was so humbled that he broke all the idols around his house, fasted for three days, and became baptized; along with his family and entire 44-member household. The now faithful judge then freed all of his Christian prisoners.

St. Valentine was later arrested again for continuing to try to convert people to Christianity. He was sent to Rome under the emperor Claudius Gothicus (Claudius II). It is believed that St. Valentine was martyred during Claudius' reign. The story tells that St. Valentine was imprisoned for marrying Christian couples and for aiding Christians being persecuted by Claudius in Rome. Both acts were considered serious crimes. A relationship between the saint and emperor began to grow and eventually Valentine attempted to convince Claudius of Christianity. Claudius became enraged and sentenced Valentine to death, commanding him to renounce his faith or be beaten with clubs and then beheaded. St. Valentine refused to renounce his faith and was executed outside the Flaminian Gate on February 14, 269.

Another variation of the legend states that St. Valentine refused to sacrifice to pagan gods, was imprisoned, and while imprisoned he healed the jailer's blind daughter. On the day of his execution, he left the girl a note signed, "Your Valentine."

Relics of St. Valentine can be found all over the world. A flower-crowned skull of St. Valentine can be found in the Basilica of Santa Maria in Cosmedin, Rome. In 1836, other relics were exhumed from the catacombs of Saint Hippolytus on the Via Tiburtina and were identified as Saint Valentine's. These were transported for a special Mass dedicated to those young and in love

Fr. John Spratt of Ireland received a gift from Pope Gregory XVI in 1836 containing a small vessel tinged with St. Valentine's blood. This gift now stands placed in the Whitefriar Street Church in Dublin.

Other alleged relics were found in Prague in the Church of St Peter and Paul at Vysehrad; in the parish church of St. Mary's Assumption in Chelmno Poland; at the reliquary of Roquemaure in France; in the Stephansdom in Vienna; in Balzan in Malta and also in Blessed John Duns Scotus' church in the Gorbals area of Glasgow, Scotland.

St. Valentine is the Patron Saint of bee keepers, engaged couples, epilepsy, fainting, greetings, happy marriages, love, lovers, travelers, and young people. He is represented in pictures with birds and roses and his feast day is celebrated on February 14.





Did You Know? IN SEARCH OF LIBERTY: 1919-1929

After the Great War, the Order continued its charitable work, offering education and employment services to returning servicemen. In less than two years, the Knights of Columbus Bureau of Employment placed some 100,000 people in jobs. The Order's presence in Europe continued as well. In August 1920, when a delegation of 235 Knights made a pilgrimage to Rome, Pope Benedict XV invited them to build several recreation centers for Roman youth. In response, the Knights constructed five playgrounds throughout the city. The architect, Count Enrico Galeazzi, went on to serve as the Knights' representative in Rome for more than six decades.

Throughout the 1920s, the Order's anti-defamation work also continued on several fronts. When the Ku Klux Klan and other "nativist" and anti-Catholic groups launched campaigns to make students attend public schools, Church leaders enlisted the Knights' support. The K of C Historical Commission, meanwhile, worked to overcome racial prejudice in American society, publishing books on the contributions of African-, Jewish-, and German-Americans.

Finally, when the Mexican government began enforcing the anti-clerical provisions of its 1917 Constitution, the Knights responded with one voice. Under President Plutarco Elias Calles, who took power in 1924, priests and religious were exiled and the free exercise of religion was forbidden. In Iniquis Afflictisque, his 1926 encyclical on the persecution of the Church in Mexico, Pope Pius XI praised the Knights' tireless work, which included a major public education campaign, diplomatic efforts and charitable support for refugees.

1920: Two years after launching educational, vocational and employment programs for World War I veterans, more than 50,000 students are enrolled in K of C-sponsored evening school programs across the United States and Canada. The Order also launches a correspondence school.

1920: 235 Knights sail from New York City to France. In Paris, they are greeted by Church and civic authorities, who thank the Knights for their WWI work. In Metz, a large equestrian statue of the French patriot Lafayette, funded by the Knights, is unveiled. The K of C delegation continues to Rome, where it is received in a private audience with Pope Benedict XV on Aug. 28, 1920.

1923: In response to the passage of laws in Oregon prohibiting children under 16 from attending private schools, the Knights work to overturn the law. In 1925, the Supreme Court declares the Oregon law unconstitutional.

1924: In response to a request from Pope Benedict XV, the Knights open St. Peter's Oratory, the first K of C recreation center for youth in Rome. Four more are established between 1924 and 1927.

1924: The Order's anti-defamation work resumes after World War I. The K of C Historical Commission publishes the Knights of Columbus Racial Contributions Series. Three monographs highlighting the positive contributions of African-, Jewish- and German-Americans are published.

1925: The Knights' Rome youth work stimulates interest in similar projects in North America, and the Columbian Squires program is established. Brother Barnabas McDonald consults with the Knights on the creation of the Squires. The institution of the first Squires circle takes place at the Supreme Council meeting in Duluth, Minn.

1926: Supreme Knight Flaherty, Deputy Supreme Knight Martin H. Carmody and other officers meet with President Calvin Coolidge about the persecution of the Catholic Church in Mexico. The Order launches a \$1 million educational campaign to influence American public opinion on the need for a strong stand against the Mexican government's attacks on the Church. It takes more than 10 years for the tensions to ease.

Pro-Life Bills Need YOUR Help

President Trump Declares "Sanctity of Life Day" on Anniversary of Roe v. Wade

President Trump on Sanctity of Human Life Day

President Trump made a strong stand for life by becoming the first president to address the national March for Life, but also by marking the tragic, 45th anniversary of Roe v. Wade, January 22nd, as "Sanctity of Human Life Day"! (Read more below, IMPORTANT Call to Action).

Santa Fe Pro-Life Rally Draws BIG Crowds

Over one thousand pro-life supporters and leaders participated in this year's Sanctity of Life and Unity Day and Pro-Life Youth Summit on January 16th & 17th in at the capitol in Santa Fe.

With innocent lives on the line, pro-life speakers including Rep. Rod Montoya (R- San Juan) stirred up enthusiasm as they talked about the importance of supporting pro-life legislation this session. Legislators who publicly claim to be Christian like Sen. Jerry Ortiz y Pino, Rep. Patricia Roybal Caballero and others were called to vote for pro-life legislation, rather than work against. Pro-Life Legislation

Three pro-life bills drafted by NMAFL were pre-filed by legislators, addressing the most extreme abortion policies in New Mexico, but only one, HB 56, the Parental Notification of Abortion, was put "on the call" by Governor Martinez. However HB 75, the Born Alive and Medical Care Act and HB 76 the Partial and Late-Term Abortion Ban were not placed on the call.

The 2018 legislative session is a 30-day budget session and the Governor has discretion over what bills are "on the call." This year, Governor Martinez staff communicated that a greater commitment from Catholic church leaders and Christian churches is needed for the pro-life bills to be placed on the call, as opposed to the level of support given to other issues at the legislature.

URGENT: What You Can Do Today

- 1) Contact the Governor's office: request she place both HB 75, the Born Alive & Medical Care Act and HB 76, the Late-Term Abortion Act on the call at 505-476-2200, emails can be sent here.
- 2) Ask your pastors, priests and other church leaders to contact the Governor's office and pledge their support for all pro-life legislation and request all pro-life bills to be put on the call.
- 3) Contact your legislator to support HB 56. Find out who your state legislators are here.

ICYMI: Tips on How to Write Your Legislator

You can start contacting your legislators now. Here are helpful tips from New Mexico State Senator Bill Sharer on what you can do to help:

- Write a polite letter urging legislators to support the <u>pro-life bills above</u> (using
 the info sheets), clearly stating a pro-life position in very real human terms, (this
 is how abortion drove me to ..., my abortion still haunts me after ____, please
 protect my daughter from this horror...)
- Legislators react to dramatic stories and want to quote 'drama' when making presentations".

Don't state the obvious, tell a story.

- Keep it on one page and only address one bill or issue at a time.
- After you write the letter, email it, fax it, snail mail it and call their office and briefly tell the story. If the letter shows up on 4 different days by 4 different methods it has 4 times the impact.
- Follow up, be persistent and continue to contact your legislators, encourage others to do the same.
